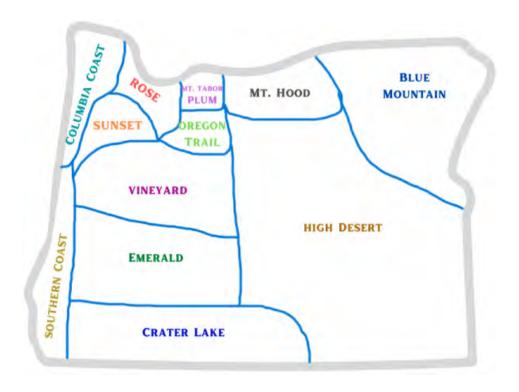

Worship

In approximately a year's time, West Linn Lutheran Church has embarked - and still is embarking - on quite an amazing journey through worship, specifically in it's music ministry. At first glance of the worship/music experience, it was very apparent that the congregation was very much in lock-step with many Lutheran liturgies, traditions, and idealizations; however, in several Worship Committee Meetings some of the same topics continue to arise: community, inclusiveness, newness, legacy, and longevity.

Questions such as, "How do we reach a younger demographic and even a more diverse demographic to come be a part of our church?" With hard questions and topics, comes harder and uncomfortable actions that must be demonstrated. For example, affording the opportunity to the church, as a whole, that one can sing praises to God WITHOUT visibly looking at lyrics to a song; it is quite an okay thing to learn a song on the spot - together - loud and proud and even strong and wrong. Imperfection, in often times, IS Perfection when praising God ("Well done, my good and faithful servant! You have been faithful over a few things; I will set you over many things." Matthew 25:21)! Another example is the ability to sing songs that may not ever having been sung in the Lutheran church: gospel, inspirational, rock, R&B, and more. When we preach, teach, and evangelize that God is infinite, we all demonstrate that through finding God in all styles of music (which means, even outside of church people can be reminded of God while listening to some of their favorite songs).

These examples, alone, have shown just how POWERFUL God is and has brought this congregation even closer together (if that's even possible since they were already so close knit). In the year 2024, plans are already being set in place to implement an annual Black History Concert Series, which will connect WLLC to an even greater diverse community and promote MORE of God's inclusive Love for others. We are also starting to plan a post Easter Sunday Service entitled, "So Amazing - An Easter After Party Service" where the whole service will be music driven to celebrate ALL that Jesus did for us at Calvary and beyond the cross! We will also be implementing some new choir ideas, such as a men's choir and bringing back a youth choir. WLLC's current Choir also continues to minister out into the community with/for other organizations within the Metropolitan area.

All-in-all, West Linn Lutheran Church is thriving in so many ways in its worship experience and music ministry. We definitely have more work to be done in some areas; however, I am confident with the help of God (who has been leading and guiding us thus far) we will continue elevating. As a famous gospel song says, "With Jesus on our side, things will work out fine; we're gonna make it!"

Choir

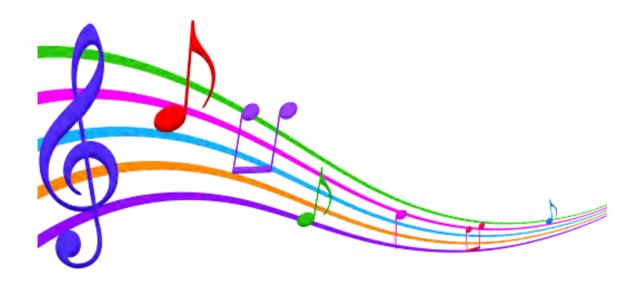

A/V and Tech

We have had an exciting year in the behind-the-scenes world of broadcasting our services through our live-streaming system!

Since October of 2022, when Josh Dolar left WLLC for other opportunities, Gary Eppelsheimer assumed the role of AV Ministries Coordinator. Realizing this was a temporary assignment, we recruited and trained some additional volunteers, to increase the reliability of staffing the AV production console for our services.

The production console is fully staffed when there are three people seated: The Video Operator switches between cameras and monitors the stream; the Graphics Operator makes sure the slides for the song lyrics and liturgy are presented for the congregation; the Audio Operator adjusts the microphone levels for the Sanctuary and the live-stream. In a pinch, we can run a service with only two—or even one—operator, but it becomes increasingly more difficult the fewer operators we have.

As you can see, we really do rely on our volunteers to present a worship service reliably and smoothly—so we continue to try to build up our volunteer staff! With more volunteers, individuals can take fewer shifts, and we will always have replacements when people are ill or on vacation. It really is a fun thing to do, and we will always provide plenty of training! Please consider volunteering!

An approaching seven-week vacation for Jan and Gary hastened our efforts to recruit a new, permanent Audiovisual Ministries Coordinator. In early August, we interviewed—and hired—Kirk Fryrear for the position. Through the remainder of August and September, Kirk shadowed Gary, and gradually took over the various responsibilities. Special thanks also to Dianne Eller, who stepped up to also learn the various systems, and help with Kirk's training. Dianne also helped reduce Kirk's initial workload by creating some of the slides and graphics for our presentation system.

We now have an excellent system, tying together three cameras, a video switcher, a soundboard, a graphics presentation system, and a small group of dedicated volunteers. We have the capability to bring worship participants into a service from their home, if necessary (for weather or illness), and—as recently demonstrated—to run a live-streamed service completely remotely, should weather make it unsafe for anyone to get to the church building.

Our current list of staff and volunteers who help at the production console include Kirk Fryrear, Jeff Young, Gabe Lenihan, Greg Lenihan, Tom Lenihan, Dianne Eller, and Gary Eppelsheimer. Please consider adding your name to the list! Special thanks also to Karl Wright, who helps keep our IT (and therefore our live-streaming capabilities) running smoothly, and also works hand-in-hand with Kirk and the pastors in creating the weekly worship guide, which helps the services to run smoothly... and also to Jack Mandeville, who helps coordinate everyone's efforts, and also contributes graphics for special events and announcements.

Our goals for the immediate future include: upgrading the operating system for our soundboard; improving the sound coverage within the Sanctuary; adding a video monitor to the back wall near the projector, so the worship leaders don't need to look at the screen behind them to see what is being projected; and, once again, adding to our distinguished list of volunteers!

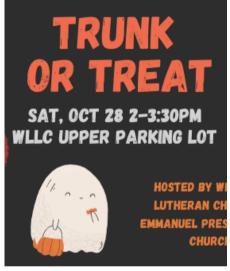


Family Ministry

Both were well attended and everyone in attendance had a great time. We also had a pizza and movie night this fall. Sunday School

It was a special year with children ages 3 to 9 attending together. By April it was apparent that by the start of the fall of 2023, the formation of two age groups of classes would need to happen. The Easter egg hunt was a huge success and the downstairs was filled with eggs and children in most every room. Our top attendance was on May 7th, when twelve children arrived in the classroom! We celebrated the end of the school year the beginning of June, with 10 children attending "Pancake & Pajama Day".

This Summer we held two afternoons of a "Fun in the Sun" days. The theme was "What Love Is", based on 1st Corinthians 13. The July date had twelve children in attendance, and the August date was attended by 8 children. At these mini camps we practiced ways to show God's love. Activities included: creating blankets for "underserved" dogs of the community, planting seeds, cheering each other on at relays using megaphones, and learning kind ways to ask others to "stop bugging" us! We even had a special puppet show about sharing.

Our Fall began with two classrooms. Michelle Calcagno is teaching grades 3 through 5th, and Gayle Aten and Gail O'Donel are teaching ages 4 through 2nd grade, with Dede Carr substituting whenever needed. We open with checking in with our classes, having music together, then continuing with teachers sharing a Bible story, often referring to the Illustrated Ministry Curriculum story cards. We are able to have meaningful discussions with these young ones, and often meet together for active games in the Discipleship Room.

The second weekend in November had two main events. The first was the "Meet & Greet" gathering to get to know and welcome Pastor John and his delightful family. Our singing was followed by a "Super-Hero" party downstairs, complete with an obstacle course, specially designed by teacher Michelle. There were two class sessions offering stories and crafts, and an advent family night. Prince of Life Lutheran Church invited our children to participate in their Christmas play, and four from our church gave enthusiastic participation. There was a large number of adults from our congregation that attended and cheered everyone on.

Our young ones also got another chance at the Christmas Eve family service to participate in another version of the wondrous story of Christmas. A special thank you to Pastor Christine and Pastor Scott who always prepared fun and meaningful ways for all of the children, big and small, to participate in the everyday happenings of our congregation. We look forward to more adventures with the nine active families participating in the Sunday School program for age 3 through 5th grade. HO.P.E. 2023

During 2023 the Oregon Food Bank's variety and amount of inventory available to HOPE was greatly diminished. As a result we spent over \$13,000 on additional food items from the OFB that are not free. However, we have received over 130,000 pounds of food from the Oregon Food Bank (OFB) with an average cost of \$0.10 per pound. Most of it is free! We also received another 70,000 lbs. donated from local businesses. Yet, we spent over another \$20,000 on food and supplies.

The number of hungry families receiving food increased 27% during 2023 from 49 to 61 each Friday. Since October, that # has continued to grow to 75 families each Friday. The need for our hungry families has continued to grow.

Since SNAP money only pays for FOOD, HOPE is also offering a choice of dignity items such as deoderant, shampoo, diapers, feminine products, toothpaste and toothbrushes. Can WLLC take on this project?

As with ALL programs serving others, the need for support has increased. We average 18 volunteers each week, but also need YOU on a Friday. Can you spare 2 hours? 8:30-10:30 or 11:45-2 or 2-4?

Thanks to ALL who have volunteered, or donated, or prayed for those less fortunate than ourselves. God Bless YOU!

May we trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. Here I am Lord!

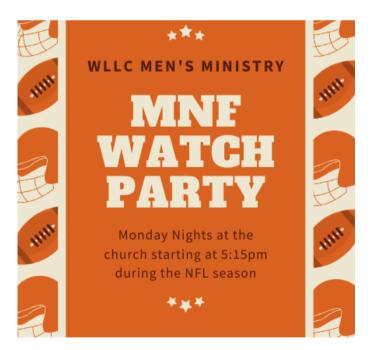


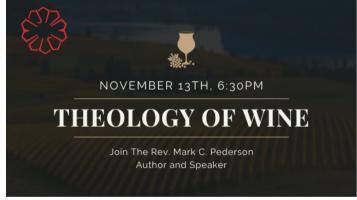
Men's Group

Women's Bible Study

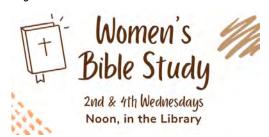
Women's Ministry: WLLC Women's Bible Study 2023

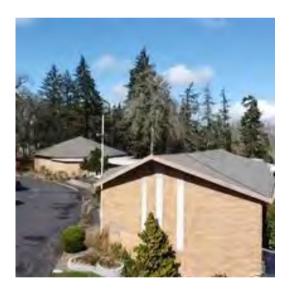


Building Committee

WLLC members have generously supported this ministry year after year. This year WLLC purchased almost \$1800 worth of Palestinian goods.
