



They work with inmates from Columbia Correctional Institution at this time. The president of Going Home II is Michael Fesser. Fesser spoke at WLLC a few years ago regarding his unlawful arrest by the WLPD and the ongoing resolution of the case.

He invited us as a community to work with him and others in building bridges between the suburbs and communities of color in Portland.
